ONE HUNDRED AND THREE YEARS OF SERVICE

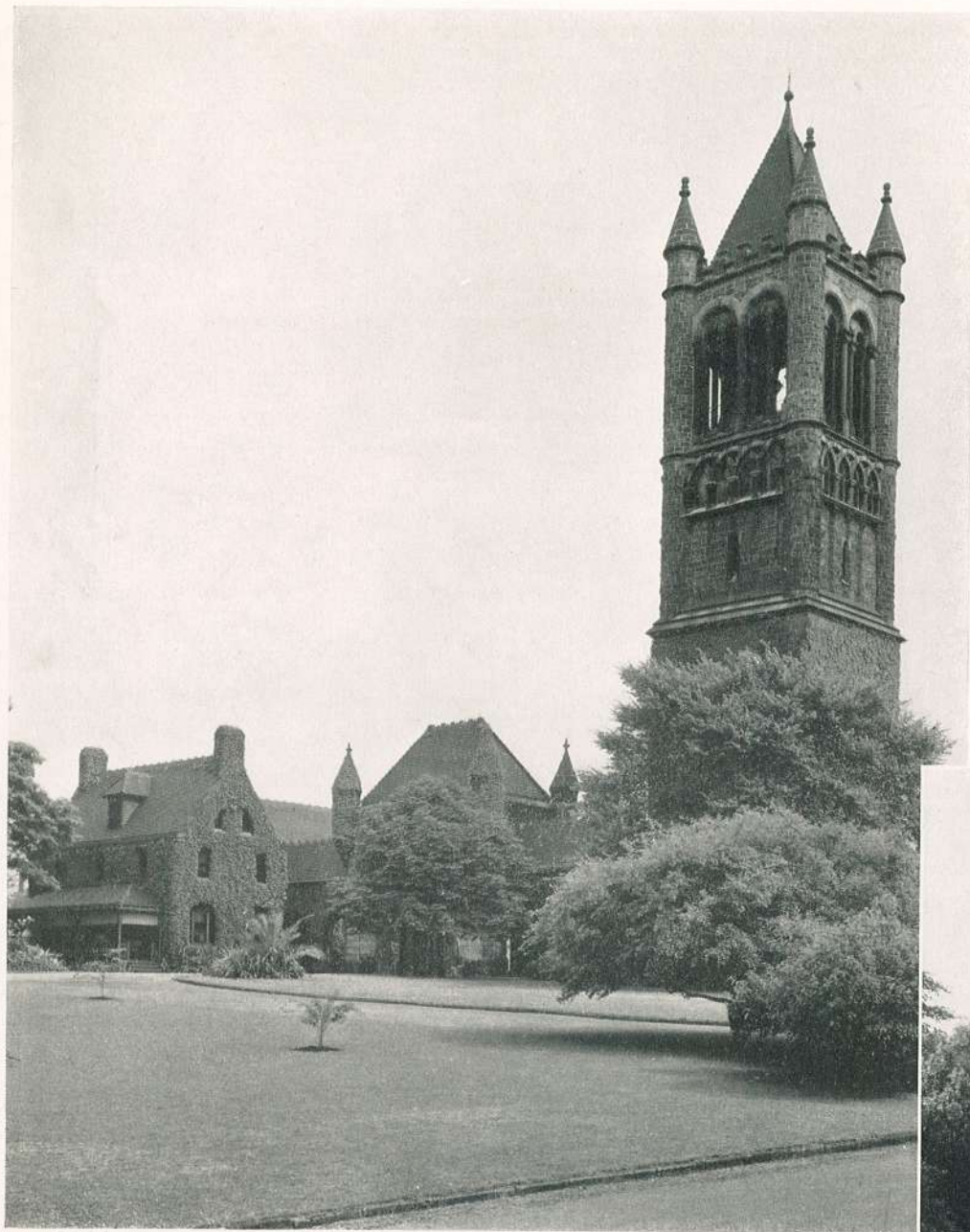
IT IS one hundred and three years since Allegheny Cemetery was incorporated, it having been chartered on April 24, 1844. The act of incorporation was approved by Governor David R. Porter and ended ten years of activity by Dr. James R. Speer and his associates to establish a cemetery to serve the cities of Pittsburgh and Allegheny. Dr. Speer had visited the cities along the Atlantic Coast from Boston to Washington and was largely responsible for keeping alive the interest that finally crystallized in this organization.

Allegheny Cemetery was the fourth institution of its kind in the United States. Its charter was drawn by the Hon. Richard Biddle, an eminent lawyer, who served as its first President.

In the beginning, Col. Bayard's homestead farm of one hundred acres was selected as the site, and to this original purchase were later added other tracts, purchased from Mrs. Mowry, the heirs of Richard Biddle, William Young, Mrs. Semple, and the Schenley estate, altogether three hundred acres.

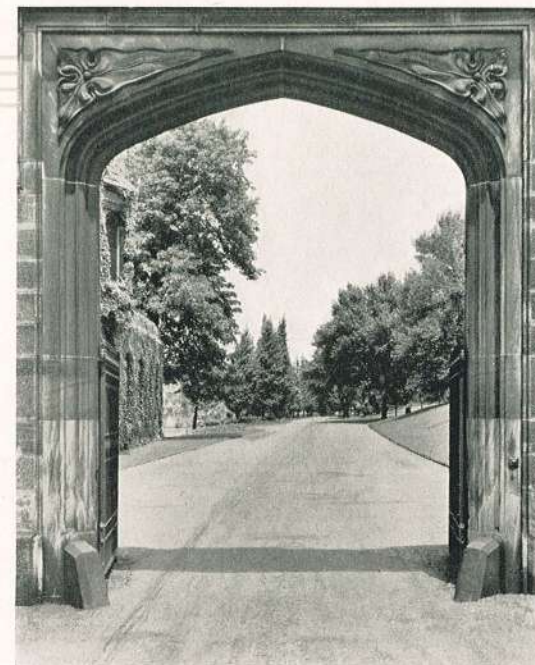
The grounds were dedicated on September 20, 1845, and the first interments were made in that month. Since then more than 83,000 burials have been made, and there are additional acres making provision for years to come.

Originally intended as a rural burial place, the Cemetery was located some miles away from the city proper. In the intervening years, the city has overtaken and surrounded it and now stretches far beyond. As the estab-

lishment of new cemeteries within the city limits is now prohibited by law, Allegheny Cemetery is truly a heritage from the past to be cherished and preserved throughout the years.

Allegheny Cemetery lies between Stanton Avenue and the Schenley estate on the north and east, Penn Avenue on the south, and St. Margaret's Hospital, Lawrenceville Park and Butler Street on the west. There are two main gateways, one on Butler Street and one on Penn Avenue. At each entrance, there is a chapel, where services may be held. There is a handsome and complete receiving vault and a modern greenhouse system, where the thousands of plants used in the Cemetery are grown.

The Cemetery is divided into forty-eight sections and offers space for single grave interments at moderate cost as well as larger plots, according to individual requirements. There are no sectarian distinctions and there is no discrimination. Here both rich and poor alike may secure a resting place for their dead.

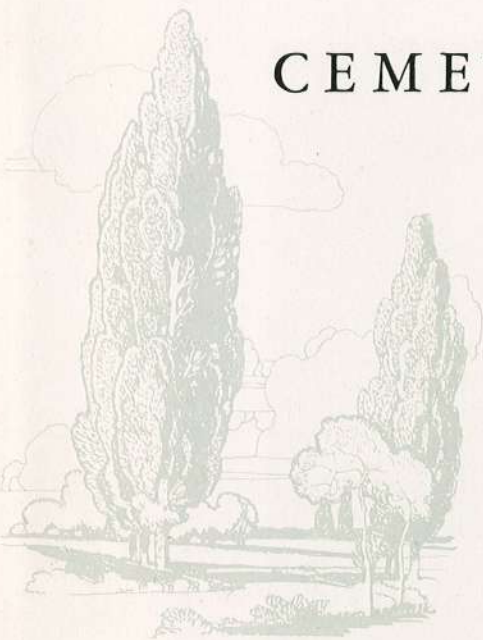
For each lot purchased an individual deed is given. Many lot owners have endowed them, thus assuring constant care for the lot itself, its memorials, and its shrubs and flowers.

Under the Cemetery's charter, no profit results from its operation for the benefit of any individual. All its moneys are used for maintenance, or improvements, or are passed to surplus as a permanent fund for its support. None of the Managers, or Incorporators, receive any compensation.

As the years have passed and the Cemetery has become surrounded by the industrial activities of modern life, its beauty has been lost to many of the people. As a reminder, the Board of Managers issues an illustrative booklet approximately once a generation. It is hoped that the present one will serve as an invitation to all who receive it to visit Allegheny Cemetery and discover its quiet charm and restful beauty. The Cemetery is open to visitors daily.

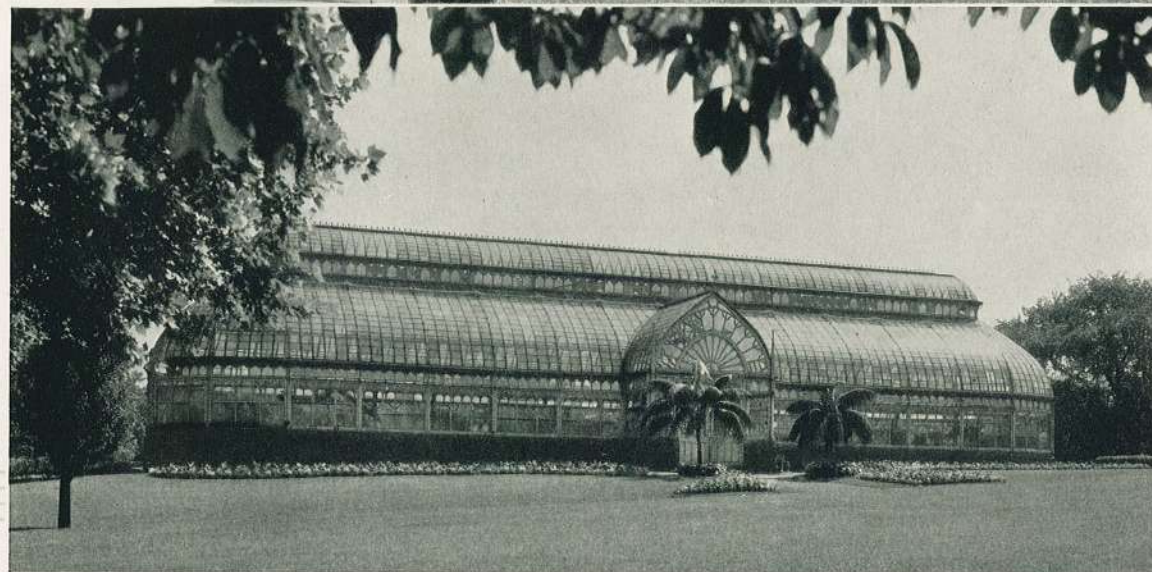

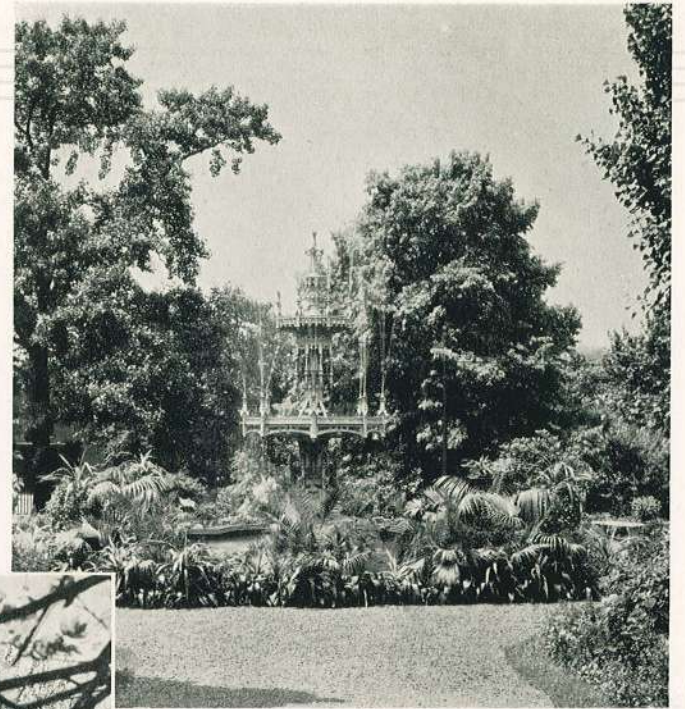

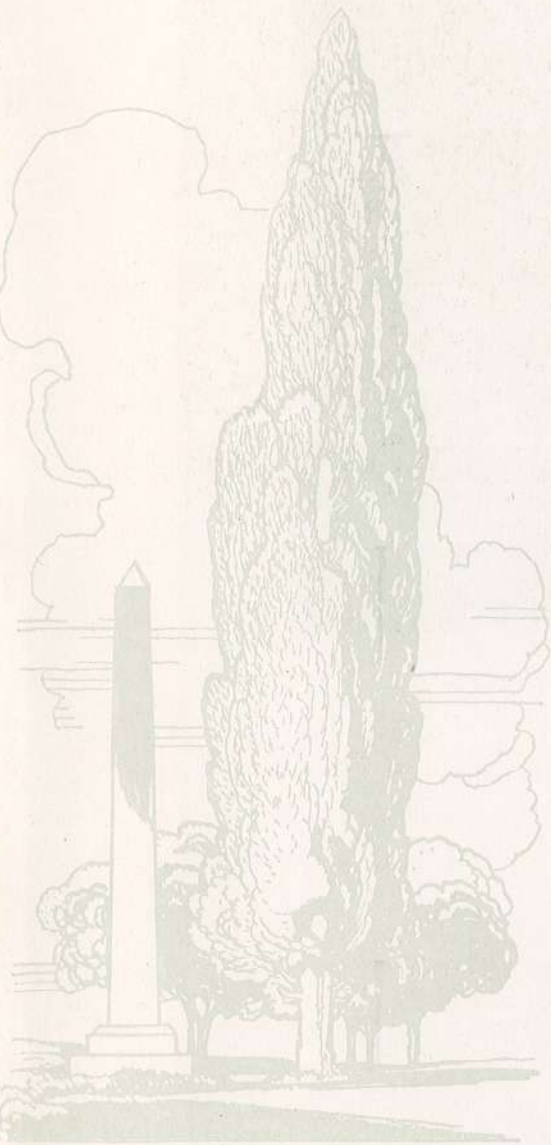

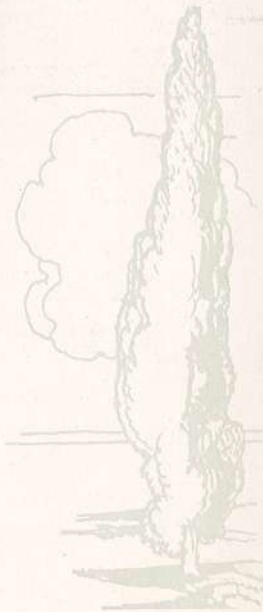

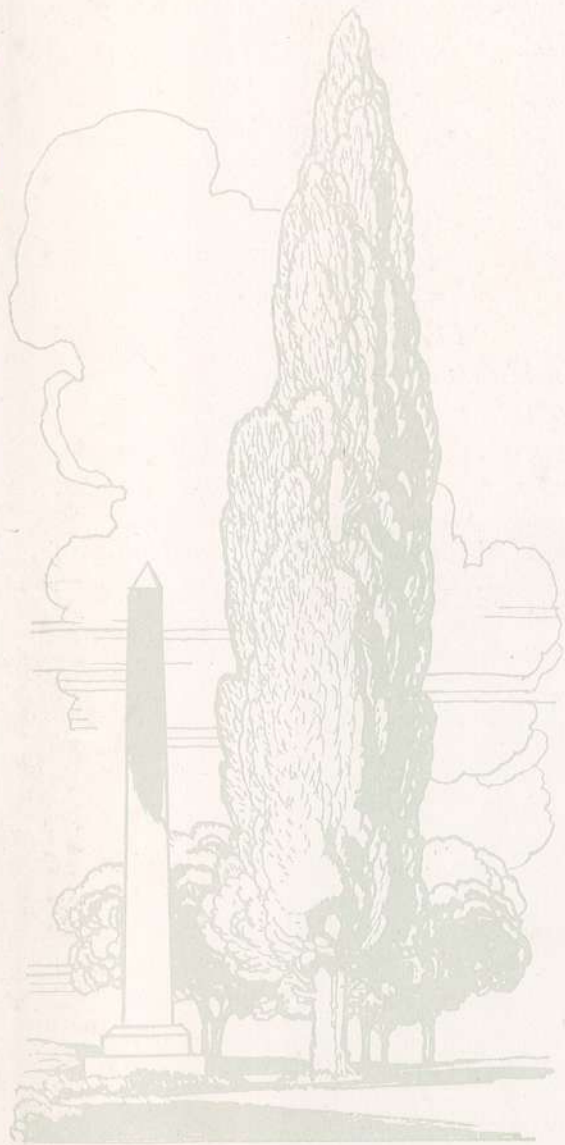

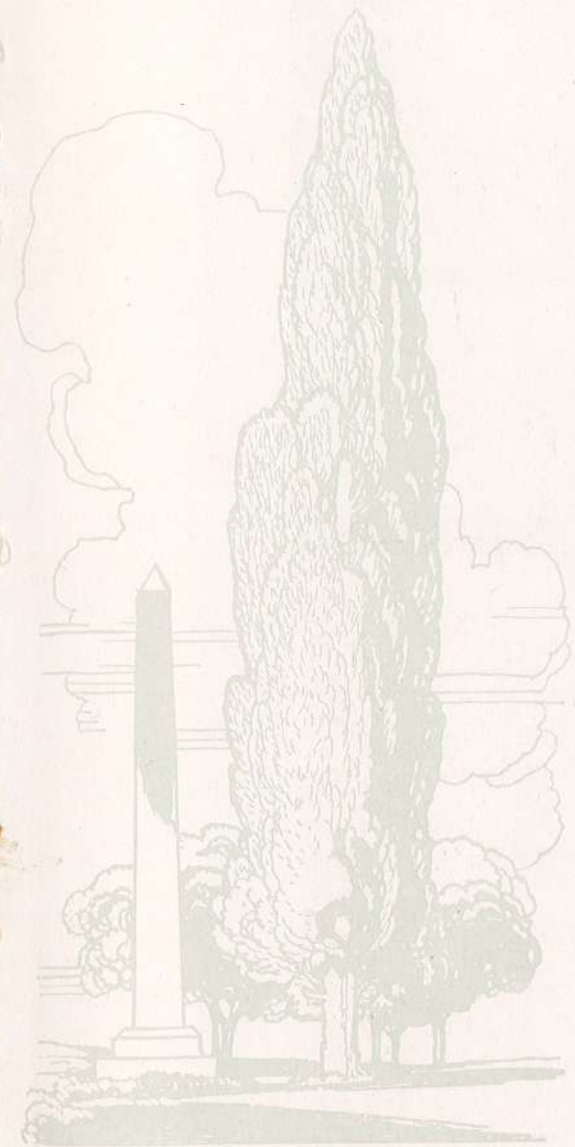

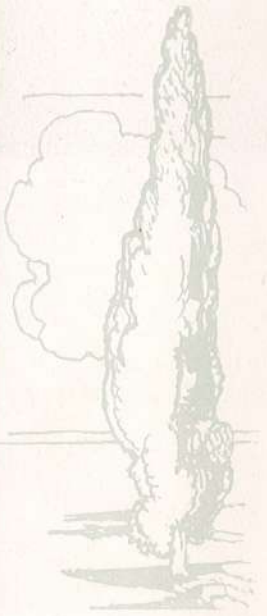


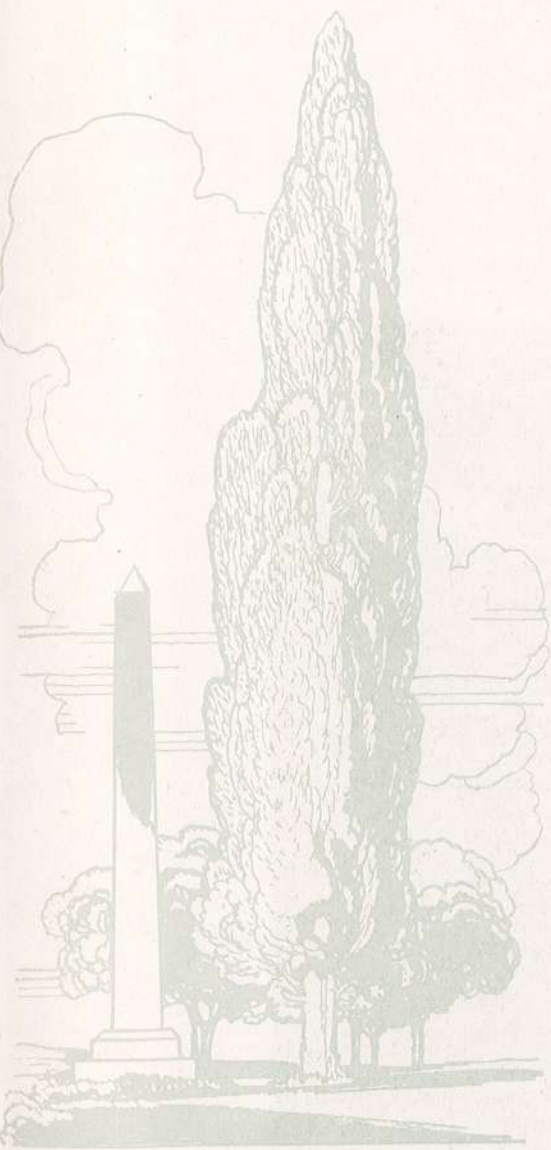

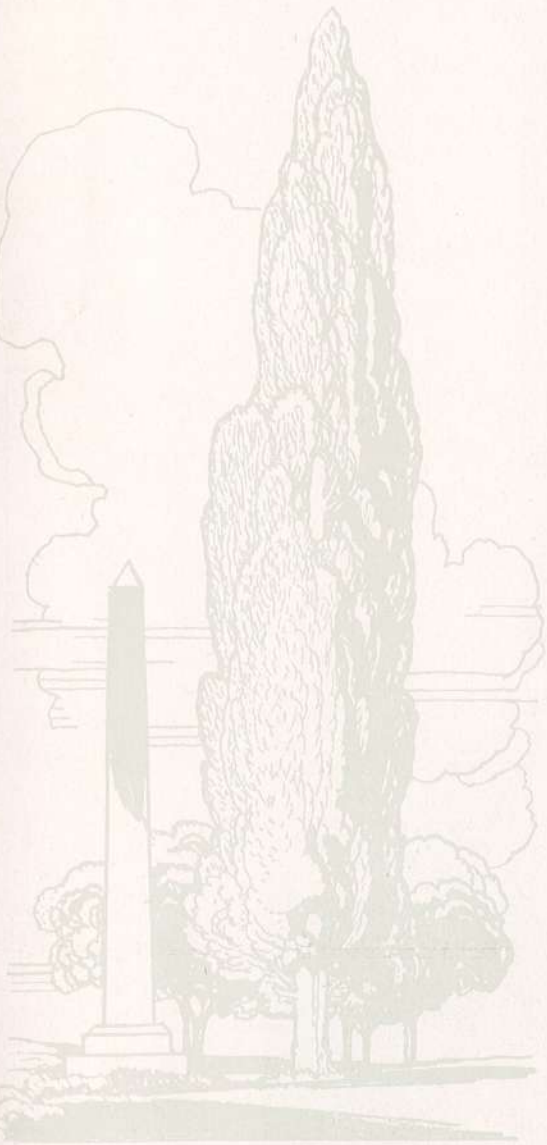

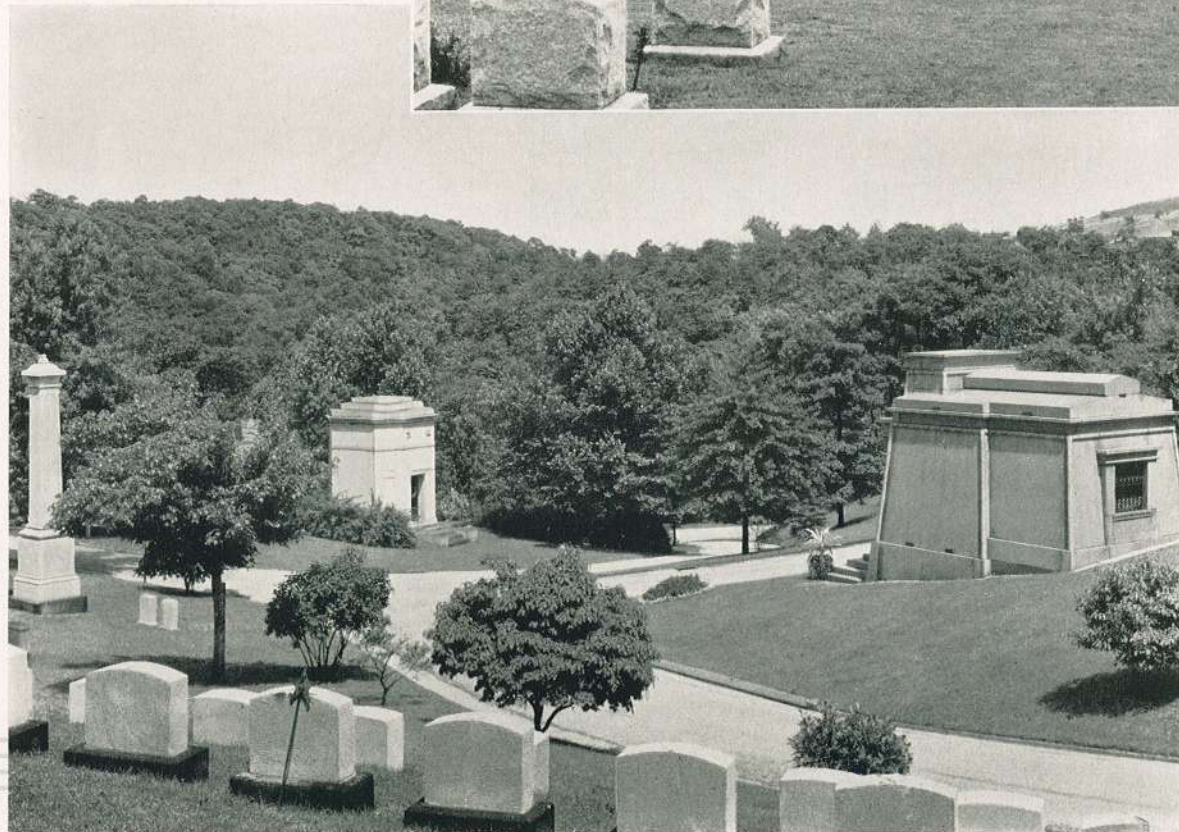
